This year, my 17-year-old sister had the amazing opportunity of presenting and co-facilitating a session at the NLBHA conference. She presented on the community-based work she did as an intern with NLBHA's Connecting Our Voices Coalition, the prevention framework used, and the benefits of having youth advocate for youth.

Seeing her prepare for this and watching her confidence grow as the expert of her own experience was wonderful to witness. This opportunity has inspired her to remain engaged in the world of advocacy and prevention because she now knows that her voice is important, valued, and heard.

This conference also gave me an opportunity to reconnect with my culture in a way that I'm not able to in my day-to-day life and in a way I didn't know I was missing. Seeing folks who look like me speaking on issues that impact our community reminded me of the importance of representation in all places, but specifically in the world of behavioral health.

It's not an easy thing to inhabit and navigate spaces that are meant to keep us out but seeing a conference full of Latinx/e professionals was exactly what I needed to fill my cup and continue the work.




CALAVERA 2nd Annual Popup Fine Art Show

Espanola Police Department presents CHAT WITH CHIEF


